Greetings Parents!

The Mathematics Department is excited to offer a free online opportunity for students to practice their Math skills over the summer. Some studies show that up to 30% of what students learn over the course of the school year is lost over the summer. As a result, we are offering the opportunity for students to maintain their mastery of skills learned previously through an online platform-- Khan Academy. Khan Academy is a non-profit educational organization which has created a set of online tools that help educate students-- especially in Mathematics. Just this past year, Khan Academy became the official partner for the College Board's Advanced Placement Program. This is an optional assignment which, if completed, will result in a 100% on a 1st quiz grade of first quarter for the student.

For students interested, please follow the below instructions:

1. Log on to [www.KhanAcademy.org](http://www.KhanAcademy.org) . You may need to make a free account, and using your school e-mail is required (unless you are an incoming new student).
2. After you have made an account, sign up for ONE of the classes under "Coaches"
  - If you are an INCOMING or current student enrolled in Algebra I, Algebra 1A, or Algebra IB/Geometry use coach code **D5CVT4YK**.
    - **To receive credit for the assignment, these students should achieve 15% Progress by July 15th, and a total of 30% achieved by the first day of class this coming Fall (approximately the week of August 20th).**
  - If you are an INCOMING or current student enrolled in Geometry, Honors Geometry, Algebra 2B, Algebra 2, H Algebra 2, H Analysis, Statistics, College Math Prep, or PreCalculus, use coach code **72QU3RTC**.
    - **To receive credit for the assignment, these students should achieve 15% Progress by July 15th, and a total of 30% achieved by the first day of class this coming Fall (approximately the week of August 20th).**
3. Begin the exercises related to the course's content. To earn % Progress, students get questions correct. If a student gets a question wrong, they can watch a video to help OR get a hint to see where they made a mistake. To gain progress with greater speed, students can take "Mastery Challenges" which allow them to get more types of problems correct at a time.
4. Students can certainly work further if they would like, but the minimum thresholds for credit are above.
